Grant will receive two years of paid employment and mentoring from an industry professional, a high school diploma, one year of college credit from Trident Technical College at no cost to him, a completion certificate for coursework that may be applied to an associate degree and national credentials from the U.S. Department of Labor.

He will be exposed to various manufacturing processes related to the assembly of material handling equipment and learn assembly techniques for building electric- and propane-powered forklifts.

"This program is a win-win for KION North America and the participating apprentice," said Jeff Peterson, production manager at KION North America. "He will gain invaluable work experience that will enhance his overall high school education with practical, real-life experiences, while KION North America aids in helping develop a stronger, highly-skilled workforce for the future."

His curriculum will include: industrial safety; hands-on assembly; reading assembly work instructions; participating in quality audits; lean manufacturing techniques such as one-piece flow, 5S and Kaizen; problem-solving techniques; how to work with torque tooling and air-powered equipment; and performing product tests and final inspections.
